How can I participate?

They will be transcribed and placed into the formal record so the CPUC can make an informed and robust decision about SDG&E, PG&E, SoCalGas, and Southwest Gas' joint application. Why am I receiving this notice?

On March 1, 2024, SDG&E joined other California gas utilities in filing an amended Hydrogen Blending Application¹ with the CPUC. In the application, SDG&E requests \$21.1 million to design, build and operate a closed-loop pipeline system and determine how to safely blend up to 20% by volume of hydrogen with natural gas. This supports the state's clean energy goals through a project that can help reduce California's reliance on fossil-based natural gas.

The test would take place in an isolated testing environment made for this project. The closed-loop system, will use plastic distribution pipe, similar to what is currently used for natural gas and will be completely closed off and separate from any real system. The test location is SDG&E's Kearny Construction and Operations Center, which is a secured facility located in Kearny Mesa. This hydrogen blending demonstration project may help determine how existing natural gas pipelines can be safely utilized to transport lower-carbon gas, supporting the transformation of California's energy system and the state's decarbonization goals.

How does the rest of this process work?

This proceeding has been assigned to a CPUC Administrative Law Judge who will consider proposals and evidence presented during the formal hearing process.

The Administrative Law Judge will issue a proposed decision that may adopt, modify or deny parties' proposals. Any CPUC Commissioner may sponsor an alternate decision with a different outcome. The proposed decision, and any alternate decisions, will be discussed and voted upon by the CPUC Commissioners at a public CPUC Voting Meeting.

Contact CPUC

Parties to the proceeding will review the application, including the Public Advocates Office. The Public Advocates Office is an independent consumer advocate within the CPUC that represents customers to obtain the lowest possible rate for service consistent with reliable and safe service levels.
